HealthPathways update

We are writing to advise that the HealthPathways for COVID-19 Case Management have been developed and approved for use nationally. Both the COVID-19 Primary Care Clinical Model and the [COVID-19 Case Management in Adults](#) pathway that support it have been informed by best practice models overseas, locally and by the expertise of the COVID-19 Clinical Advisory Group.

The approved [COVID-19 Case Management in Adults](#) pathway can now be localised within your region. An unlocalised version of the pathway has been published on your site this afternoon to inform your primary care users of the nationally agreed approach to COVID-19 care in the community until your localised version is available.

The pathways are primarily written to support General Practice clinical care and decision making, but there are wider community-based clinicians in pharmacy, midwifery, physiotherapy, occupational therapy and community nursing who may also find these resources useful to understand in the context of their work.

Please inform all General Practice and community-based clinicians in your district about the release of these pathways and the upcoming webinar.
